Cavaliers Tame The Tigers

The Coldwater Cavaliers recorded a decisive victory over the Versailles Tigers Friday night by a score of 31-0. The Cavs dominated every aspect of the game in this opening weekend of MAC play and moved their record to 2-1. The Tigers, who are struggling with injuries and inconsistency, dropped to 0-3.

The Cavalier defense was stout in recording their first shutout of the season and the first shutout for Coach Mark Bruns who leads the defense. Allowing just 24 yards rushing, 30 yards passing and three first downs in the first half, the Cavs really stiffened in the second half allowing just 27 more yards and no first downs to finish with just 81 yards of total defense.

After the game, former Coach Tim Hoyng congratulated Coach Bruns on his first 'goose'. Coach Bruns responded "Thanks, and what is this 'Goose Dance' the kids are telling me about?". "You'll find out!" Coach Hoyng replied.

The Coldwater offense continues to improve as well. With 130 yards rushing and 223 yards passing the offense finished with 353 yards on 58 total plays, a 6 yard average per play.

Coldwater scored twice in the first quarter on two passes (31 yards and 39 yards) from Brody Hoying to Adam Klosterman. Mitch Schoenherr caught a second quarter pass from Hoying for a 41 yard score and in the fourth quarter he scored on a one yard run. Matt Kremer who was 4-4 on PAT kicks also had a 26 yard field goal in the fourth, his first this season.

Schoenherr had a big game, rushing for 55 yards, scoring one touchdown and catching three passes for 62 yards and another touchdown. Klosterman caught 6 passes for 111 yards and two touchdowns. Hoying continues to improve as he

rushed 10 times for 50 yards and was 16 of 26 passing for 228 yards and three touchdowns.

Each team committed an interception and neither fumbled the ball. Coldwater punted once while Versailles punted it 6 times.

Next Up - Delphos St. John

Expectations have been high for the Blue Jays this season but they have gotten off to a tough start dropping their first two games to Elida and LCC. Things improved last week as they defeated St. Henry 38-20 to notch their first win.

DSJ will lean heavily on senior RB Tyler Jettinghoff (6-2, 210), a two-time All-Midwest Athletic Conference selection who ran for 1,790 yards and 20 TDs last year. Senior fullback Luke MacLennan (5-10, 205) who had 603 yards and nine TDs last season returns along with senior linebackers Spencer Ginter and Ryan Shumaker. Head coach Todd Schulte who is 144-41 in 14 years) said that "Once again this year's schedule will be brutal. The key for our 2013 season will be quarterback play and health."
