



Flyers Deal the Cavaliers a Lopsided Loss

The Marion Local Flyers totally dominated the Coldwater Cavaliers before a standing room only crowd at Booster Field in Maria Stein Friday night by a final score of 47-14. The Flyers overwhelmed the younger Cavalier squad on both sides of football. Their defense proved stronger and quicker than Coldwater's and their offense used big plays, usually the hallmark of Coldwater teams, to put the Cavaliers away in swift fashion.

The first quarter was the only one that was really competitive as the Flyers scored first on an 8 play 32 yard drive to take a 6-0 lead at the 6:42 mark. Coldwater answered immediately as Brody Hoying hooked up with Adam Klosterman on a 19 yard pass to give the Cavaliers a brief 7-6 lead. Marion Local came right back with a 7 play 67 yard drive, scoring on a 41 yard pass to take the lead back at 12-7.

On Coldwater's next possession the Flyers recovered a fumble at the Cavalier four yard line. It only took one play to score again and the Flyers led 19-7 as the second quarter began. The Flyers scored two more times in the second, each time on one play drives. Early in the third they again scored on a one play drive to take a 40-7 lead.

Coldwater scored it's final touchdown with 3:28 to play in the third quarter as Hoying again hooked up with Klosterman on a 12 yard pass to close the gap to 40-14. But the Flyers added one more score midway through the final period to set the final score at 47-14.

Dropped balls and turnovers hurt the Cavaliers most. The Flyers intercepted two passes and recovered one of the Cavalier's six fumbles. Most of the dropped balls occurred in the

Coldwater back field as the result of a missed hand-off or good 'ole slobber-knocker hits by the Flyer defenders. And that pretty well sums up the game. Marion Local was more aggressive and executed the finer football skills better than Coldwater did on this night.

Hoying led the Cavalier attack on offense with 127 yards rushing on 17 carries. Those yards were hard fought as he was sacked for a total of -40 yards. Hoying completed only 9 of his 21 passes for 71 yards and 1 interception. Klosterman caught 4 passes for 47 yards and Drew Otten caught two more for 17 yards. Coldwater totaled 275 yards of offense on the night while Marion Local rushed for 122 and passed for another 213 for a total of 335 yards.

The Cavaliers drop to 6-2 overall and into a second place tie with Minster at 5-1 in the MAC. Marion Local stays perfect on the year at 8-0 (6-0 MAC) and should be the odds-on-favorite to play for the inaugural Division VII state title in Stark County come December.
