Cavaliers Get Back on Track with Victory Over Parkway

It only took fifteen seconds for the Coldwater Cavaliers to rebound from their stinging defeat at Marion Local. Brody Hoying intercepted a Parkway pass on the first play from scrimmage and returned it 21 yards for a touchdown. Coldwater scored another 21 first quarter points and never looked back enroute to a convincing 48-6 victory over the Panthers.

Parkway has hampered by the loss of three of their starters due to injuries and unlike Coldwater they lack depth. The Cavaliers starters began stepping out midway through the second quarter giving the junior varsity significant playing time under the Friday night lights.

On the Cavaliers second possession, Hoying scored on a 28 yard run then on their next series he found Matt Kramer on a three yard pass for Kramer's first receiving TD of the season. On their fourth possession of the first quarter Hoying scored again on an 8 yard run.

Nick Staugler got in on the scoring action as he opened the second quarter with a 3 yard TD run. Late in the second Kremer caught his second TD pass, this time from the arm of sophomore quarterback Jack Hemmelgarn from 27 yards out.

Kramer was good on five of his six PAT kicks and Coldwater went to the locker room leading 41-0.

The second half was pretty uneventful as Coach Chip Otten made maximum use of his reserves and working mostly from the rushing pages of the playbook just salted the game away. On the night, Coldwater utilized 11 rushers, 9 receivers and three quarterbacks, two kickers and two punters. The Cava-

liers ran the ball 39 times for 382 yards led by Kraig Schoenherr's 63 yards, Mitch Schoenherr's 47 and Hoying's 36.

Hoying was 6 for 6 passing for 89 yards, Hemmelgarn 8 of 12 for 76 and Greg Gilliland, who played his first game since breaking his collarbone in the preseason was 1 of 3 for 8 yards. In total the three QBs were 15 of 21 for 173 yards. Adam Klosterman had 44 yards receiving, Kramer had 39 yards and Drew Otten had 34 yards.

Defensively the Cavaliers allowed 150 yards on the ground and just 61 through the air for a total of 211 yards. Derek Thobe had 1 interception in addition to Hoying big pick-6.

With the victory, Coldwater moves to 7-2 while Parkway drops to 3-6. Parkway has not defeated Coldwater since a 33-7 decision in 1988, a twenty five year drought for the Panthers.

Next up Coldwater makes the 12 mile drive to Fort Recovery to face the 3-6 Indians. The Fort has never defeated Coldwater on the gridiron as the Cavs have won all 14 of their meetings since the Indians joined the MAC.
