Cavaliers Defeat Delphos St. John - Win MAC Title

The Coldwater Cavaliers accomplished what some said could not be done.

On Friday night the Cavaliers defeated the visiting Blue Jays of Delphos St. John 32-6 and earned a share of their 19th Midwest Conference Title and locked up the #2 seed in the Division 5 / Region 20 State Playoffs.

The Cavaliers graduated 22 seniors after the 2015 campaign, 19 of whom were starters and only three juniors made significant contributions to the 2015 State Championship team. But the 2016 team persevered through ups and downs and survived with only has one blemish on their record. Lesson: Ignore the chatter, play the game.

With the victory the Cavs finished the season 7-1 (9-1 overall) to earn a share of their 19th Midwest Athletic Conference title. It is the second consecutive MAC title for the Cavs who the won outright title last season.

The Cavaliers also locked up a spot in the playoffs for the 20th consecutive year which is the longest currently active streak among all Ohio high schools.

Delphos came to Coldwater needing a victory to earn a spot in the post season. Coldwater put those hopes to rest in just one play.

The Jays went three and out after getting the opening kickoff and had to punt. Nate Rindler caught the ball at his own 28, took of on a dead run down the right sidelines and after getting some key blocks made his way into the end zone for a 72 yard punt return and Coldwater led 7-0 with only 2:30 off the game clock.

It was Rindler's second punt return for a TD this season the other being a 64 yard return against Ft. Recovery.

Coldwater scored again with just 6 seconds left it the first quarter as Neal Muhlenkamp scored on an 18 yard run. His PAT kick failed and Coldwater led 13-0.

Delphos answered back when the got the ball moving 66 yards in nine plays and scored on a 26 yard pass to close the gap to 13-6 after they missed the PAT.

Late in the second Coldwater on a 1 yard Brad Giere run and the halftime score was 19-6 as again Muhlenkamp missed the PAT kick.

The Cavaliers then took the second half kick and 81 yards in just 8 plays when Dylan Thobe ran it in from 5 yards out. A PAT pass attempt failed and the score was 25-6 in favor of the home team.

The final score of the night came on Coldwater's next possession as Rindler took a hand off from the Coldwater 26 off right tackle and ran untouched in to the end zone. Muhlenkamp completed the PAT and set the final score at 32-6.

An interesting note to that play is that the Coldwater center Spencer Kuess was the second player Cavalier into the end zone after provide a nice screen/block on a pursuing Blue Jay at the five yard line.

Statistically, Rindler led Coldwater with 112 yards rushing on 5 carries. Add his punt return and a 22 yard kick off return to, Rindler had 206 all purpose yards.

Muhlenkamp had 90 yards on four carries and Thobe had 38 on six totes. Muhlenkamp also had 60 receiving yards and Louis Berry added 30 more.

Thobe was 7 of 11 passing for 64 yards and Sam Broering complete one of his six passes for 42 yards..

For the night Coldwater had 400 total yards of offense with 294 rushing yards and 106 passing.

The Cav defense was stellar allowing only 3 rushing yards and 190 passing yards. Brad Giere intercepted a pass. Andrew Siefring who Coach Otten referred to as a beast after the game had six tackles with five assists for a total of 11 tackles including 3 sacks and assists on 2 other sacks. On the season Siefring has 99 tackles, 8 for loss and 12 QB sacks to lead all Coldwater defenders.

Up next for Coldwater is a week 11 meeting with Brookville a regional quarterfinal matchup at Cavalier Stadium. The game will be next Saturday night at 7pm. See page two for more on Brookville and Coldwater's playoff history.

Props for Otten! For Coach Chip Otten, it was his 88th victory in his 100th game at Coldwater. That's a winning percentage of 88% which is the best of all Coldwater head coaches. Otten has led the Cavaliers to the playoff in each of his seven seasons including 7 "Trips to the Ship" winning four consecutive state titles.

The run to an eighth consecutive trip to the State Finals begins this week at Cavalier Stadium as Coldwater will host the 5-5 Brookville Blue Devils.

These two teams met in last seasons Regional Final which Coldwater won 31-13.

Brookville enters the game with a two game losing streak but thanks to a couple of wins against D3 schools Bellbrook and Eaton, they find themselves in the playoff albeit with the worst record of all the D5 schools in the dance.

But that is the beauty of the Harbin system, if you beat good teams from bigger schools you get rewarded. So the Blue Devils have earned this appearance.

This year they feature a stout running game led by Bailey Wallen who has accumulated 1632 yards while averaging over 5 yards per carry.

As a team they score 26 points per game while allowing 25.8.

A look at their opponents and one gets the impression they play a strong schedule. But the teams they beat were only 22-
