Cavaliers Exorcise the Blue Devils 47-13

The Coldwater Cavaliers opened the playoff season with a resounding victory over an overmatched Brookville Blue Devils squad by a final score of 47-13. And it did not take long to settle the issue either.

The Cavaliers scored five times it the first half while the Blue Devils scored twice. What really stands out though is that Coldwater's total time of possession in the first half was 4:32. Their five scoring drives only required 11 plays. Meanwhile Brookville's two scoring drives used 24 plays and 19:28 on the game clock.

Dylan Thobe started the scoring with a one yard run to give Coldwater a 6-0 lead.

After forcing Brookville to punt, the Cavs only needed one play as Thobe found Neal Muhlenkamp for a 48 yard strike and after a successful PAT, the lead was 13-0 at the end of the first quarter

Brookville took the ensuing kickoff and using about 8 minutes drove 94 yards on 17 plays to score on a 2 yard dive. A missed PAT left the score 13-6.

Once again Coldwater wasted no time in responding, driving 89 yards in just 3 plays as Thobe connected with Rindler in a 70 yard pass to extend the lead to 20-6.

After the Blue Devils fumbled the kick off return, Thobe hit Louis Berry on a 20 yard pass and Coldwater led 27-6.

Brookville was not about to give up though as they used 7 plays to drive 79 yards to pull within two scores at 27-13.

Again, Coldwater answered on

the strength of a 42 yard kick off return by Rinder and a 44 yard pass from Thobe to Zach Klosterman on the first play of the drive. Coldwater led at halftime 34-13.

After the Coldwater Band put on a spectacular halftime show (the drum line - you gotta see) the Cavaliers scored on their opening drive. Needing just 4 plays, they drove 56 yards and moved the lead to 41-13.

Thobe left the game having completed 7 of his 10 passes for 243 yards and four touchdowns. Backup QB Sam Broering picked up where Thobe left off.

On the last play of the third quarter Broering found Klosterman on a post pattern. Big-K had a good 9 inches on his defender as he snagged the pass and ran into the end zone to complete a 62 yard scoring play. The score sat at 47-13 after three and the clock ran the entire fourth quarter.

Brookville retires for the season finishing 5-6. Coldwater moves to 10-1. That tenth win give the Cavaliers a streak of 17 seasons with at least 10 wins.

In addition to Thobe's 243 passing yards Broering was 5 of 6 for 125 yards giving the Cavs 368 passing yards.

Klosterman led all receivers with 152 yards on 4 catches. Rindler had one for 70, Muhlenkamp and Ben Wenning each caught a pass for 48 yards while Berry caught two for 36.

With all that passing yardage and Brookville dominating time of possession the running game took a break as Seth Obringer had 21 yards on 7 carries while Thobe picked up 19 on 4 totes. Brad Giere had two rushes for 14 yards.

Neal Muhlenkamp, who was named MAC first team receiver, safety and kicker, kicked off 8 times for 414 yards or 52 yards per kick.

In total the offense produced 427 yards on just 32 plays. While the defense allowed 293 yards on 59 plays.

On defense Ryan Vagedes picked off his third pass of the season as the Blue Devils managed just three completions on 8 attempts for 27 yards.

The rushing attack was Brookville's strong suit as they tallied 266 yards on 51 carries.

Ryan Knapke had 15 tackles while Andrew Siefring had 12 tackles and one QB sack. Cody Giere also had 12 tackles while Seth Obringer had 4 tackles and one sack. Patrick Klosterman returned for an injury that sidelined him for about a month as he recorded seven tackles.

Division 5 Region 20 Semifinal Preview

Three of the four games in the opening round of the Region 20 playoffs were not very competitive. CHCA, Coldwater and Milton Union all won decisive victories on their home field. Carlisle lost at home on a questionable play call by the Carlisle coach with seconds to play.

Carlisle had led most of the game 14-7, but Greenview scored twice to take a 21-14 lead late in the final quarter.

Carlisle got a late touchdown and after calling a timeout, chose to go for two on the PAT to win the game.

Their quarterback who was already hobbled by a leg injury attempted to run left on the extra point play, but slipped and was tackled for a loss. The onside kick was

recovered by Greenview and they killed the clock to seal the victory.

As a result Greenview will face Coldwater in a Regional Semi-final game at Sidney Memorial Stadium. CHCA will play Milton-Union in the other Semi-final.

Greenview from the Ohio Heritage Conference is 9-2 and will meet Coldwater who is 10-1 for the first time on the football field.

Greenview features the run about 75% of the time. J. Green and G. Mangen have combined for 1300 of the teams 2500 rushing yards.

Their quarterback, C. Matt has 893 yards on 59 or 105 passing. Their leading receivers are E. Bradds and C. Wilson who each have dozen reception for about 250 yards each.

On defense I. Harding and A. Roberts each have 64 tackles. Harding leads the team with 6 sacks.

The Rams average about one more TD per game than the Cavaliers. The teams they beat are 32-60 while Coldwater's vanquished are 52.44.

MAC Power

The MAC is 65-2 in first round playoff games against non-MAC schools since the playoffs expanded to eight qualifiers per region in 1999.
