Lots of Spots to Fill as Cavaliers Prepare for the Wildcats

The preseason outlook for Coldwater football looks much as it did at the start of the 2013 season. That year the Cavaliers were defending state championship but lost 23 seniors to graduation. This season the Cavs look to defend their fourth consecutive state title having lost 22 seniors to graduation.

Some would say that Coldwater will be in a rebuilding mode. Others more familiar with Midwest Conference Football in general and Cavalier football specifically would be apt to say 'their gonna reload'. As with any high school sport, one can never take it for granted. Even more so when one has a target on their back.

The reality is that the Cavs must replace 19 of 22 starters. The three returning senior lettermen are OL/DL Troy Sanning (6-1, 210), WR/DB/K Neal Muhlenkamp (6-2, 195) and QB/LB Dylan Thobe (6-4, 180) will be expected to provide experienced leadership.

Despite losing so many seniors there were a few players who saw some playing time last season and they will be expected to move into starting roles this season including; senior DE Patrick Klosterman (6-1, 190), senior DE Andrew Siefring (6-1, 190), senior LB/TE Zach Klosterman (6-5, 200) and junior RB/LB Bradley Giere (5-11, 190).

And as for the schedule, well it is loaded. As members of the Midwest Athletic Conference, the schedule is always tough. For the defending MAC Champs, the task at hand in 2016 is challenging.

Once again the Cavaliers will open up the season against the Kenton Wildcats.

The Wildcats will feature senior quarterback Trent Hites (5-9, 175), who threw for 1,610 yards and 13 touchdowns and ran for 684 yards and five touchdowns last year.

Five of last seasons six receivers return, led by senior receiv-

er Chris Deardorff (5-11, 170), who had 46 receptions for 544 yards and six touchdowns.

On defense, the Cats return a half dozen players that posted 36 tackles or more last year. Senior defensive back Austin Buroker (6-2, 190) led the team with 131 tackles last year.

Look for it to be a late night as Kenton Coach Brent Fackler has said that they will pass on every down. That means a lot of clock stoppages. The Cavalier defense will look to limit offensive snaps for the Cats while the Coldwater offense will look to control the ball and the clock while scoring on a high percentage of their possessions.
