Cavaliers Defeat Wildcats in a High Scoring Affair

Coldwater traveled to Kenton on Friday night for their annual season opener. It was a long night but not because the two teams pass more than they run. Mother Nature showed up and brought a 90 minute lightening delay which threatened to suspend the game until Saturday morning, but she did not have near the fire power of the two offenses. In the end, a fast start by the Cavaliers put enough distance between themselves and the Wildcats to give Coldwater a 58-39 victory.

Coldwater scored six first half touchdowns to take a 42-14 lead at halftime. Kenton outplayed the Cavaliers in the second half with four touchdowns of their own, but it was not enough as Coldwater added three more scores and ran precious seconds off the clock to seal the victory.

Dylan Thobe was the star of the game as he made his first start as a varsity quarterback one for the record book. Thobe scored five touchdowns on runs of 9, 2, 8, 15 and 28 yards. Those thirty points allow him to join Tyler Vogel, Kevin Hoying, Ross Homan and Caleb Siefiring for most points scored in a game at Coldwater. On the night he totaled of 116 yards on 18 carries and was 16 of 23 passing for 317 yards and three

more touchdowns.

Neal Muhlenkamp caught two touchdown passes, one for 34 yards and another for 72. He added his first career field goal, a 27 yarder in the third quarter and went 7 for 7 in PAT attempts to post a total of 22 points. He caught a total of three passes for 130 yards.

Nate Rinder caught 4 passes for 92 yards including one for a 50 yard touchdown. Brad Giere had 60 yards rushing on 12 carries and Zach Klosterman caught 4 passes for 47 yards. Louis Barry totaled 44 yards on a pair of receptions.

The Cavalier offense totaled 198 rushing yards and 317 passing for a total of 515 yards.

The Cavalier defense bent, frequently, but did not break. Andrew Siefiring, Code Giere and Ryan Knapke each had 8 tackles. Siefiring and Patrick Klosterman each added a quarterback sack and Sam Broering intercepted one pass.

As a unit the defense allowed the high powered Kenton offense to tally 357 passing and 65 rushing yards, or 422 total yards.

The 58 points Coldwater scored was the most since the 2014 State Championship

game against when they scored 2 against Canton Central Catholic. The two teams combined for 97 points, the most since that classic Kettering Alter playoff game in 2007 when the two teams combined for 111.

Next up Coldwater travels to Stadium Park in Delphos to meet Jefferson Wildcats who defeated Shawnee 34-6 in their opener. Last season the Wildcats were 10-2 and advanced to the regional semifinals. They return six All-NWC players and will feature an extremely talented senior trio in RB Hunter Binkley (5-8, 160/1,500 yards rushing, 23 TDs), WR/DB Drew Reiss (6-1, 170/32 tackles, three INTs) and QB/DB Jace Stockwell (5-11, 170/1,240 yards passing, 16 TDs). The defensive line features senior Brandan Herron (6-4, 290/32 tackles) and junior Davion Tyson (6-4, 210/40 tackles). Head coach Chris Sommers is 18-5 in two seasons.

This will be the last scheduled meeting between these two teams. The Cavs will travel to Clinton-Massie in week 2 next season.
