Cavaliers Defeat an Improved Parkway Team 41-7

The Coldwater Cavalier continued their quest for a perfect season and an MAC title as they defeated the Parkway Panthers by a score of 41-7.

The Cavs moved to 6-0 while the Panthers fell to 1-5. But don't let the final score or their record fool you. The Panthers are improving under a new head coach and doing things that teams need to do to get better.

On this night the first quarter belonged to the Panthers as they came out with guns blazing. Winning the toss and taking the opening kickoff they drove 76 yards in just six plays with a 41 yard pass for a touchdown and they went up 7-0

Coldwater responded quickly needing just four plays to drive 74 yards, the final 24 coming on a Neal Muhlenkamp run off right tackle. After Muhlenkamp's PAT kick the score was tied at 7-7.

On their next possession the Panthers look to answer as they mixed a bruising run game and an unexpected flair of passes to move inside the Cavaliers 15. But a fumble on fourth down ended their threat. Despite that result it was evident the Panthers came to compete.

But blessed with more athletes and numbers, the Cavaliers began to wrest control from the Panthers.

Coldwater took the ball and used 10 plays to cover 86 yards. Dylan Thobe covered the last three yards on the ground and Coldwater took a 14-7 lead at the 11:21 mark of the second quarter.

Three minutes later Jacob

Hartings caught a Thobe pass for 15 yards to complete a four play 54 yard drive and the lead was extended to 21-7.

On their next possession Coldwater needed just two plays. Muhlenkamp got behind the linebackers and took a quick pass from Thobe and rambled 78 yards to the Panthers 1 yard line. Seth Obringer scored from there. The score moved to 28-7 as Thobe completed the PAT kick while Muhlenkamp was on the sidelines catching his breath.

Coldwater totaled 331 first half yards while Parkway gained 253. So despite the three score deficit, Parkway was moving the ball against their State Route 118 rivals but turnovers and failed conversions cost them.

The Cavaliers scored two more times in the third on a 9 yard run by Thobe and a five yard pass from JV quarterback Sam Broering to Muhlenkamp. Muhlenkamp missed one of the two PATs and Coldwater took a 41-7 lead into the final quarter.

JVs saw action the rest of the night and valuable playing time under the lights was enjoyed by both teams.

On the night 10 Coldwater rushers tallied stats led by Thobe (6-57), Rindler (2-55), Obringer (9-31), Muhlenkamp 1 -24) and Brad Giere (2-21). Jacob Hartings, Caleb Dippold, Broering and Mitch Niekamp also had rushing yardage.

Thobe was 11 of 17 passing for 212 and one touchdown. Broering was a perfect 5 for 5 for 27 yard and one TD.

Eight Cavaliers caught passes led by Muhlenkamp (5-129)

and Zach Klosterman (3-58). Others catching passes include Broering, Rindler, Hartings, Obringer as well as Alex and Jack Muhlenkamp.

As a team Coldwater gained 214 on the ground and 249 in the air for a total of 463. After allowing 253 first half yards, the defense adjusted and allowed just 31 in the second for a total of 284 yards.

Next up Coldwater goes to Minster to face a struggling Wildcat squad who are tied for last place in the MAC with New Bremen at 0-4 and 2-4 overall.

As we move into the final four games of the regular season (already?), here are some season stats for Coldwater. Coldwater is scoring 31.2 points per game while allowing 15.3. They have converted 10 of 15 fourth down attempts (67%) and are plus 7 in the turnover category.

Dylan Thobe leads all rushers with 483 yards in 98 attempts. Brad Giere has 167 on 30 rushes.

Thobe is 68 of 120 passing for 1163 yards and 9 TDs with only 1 interception. Neal Muhlenkamp has caught 24 passes for 473 yards and Zach Klosterman 21 for 336.

Andy Siefring leads all tacklers with 60, 6 for loss and 6 sacks. Ryan Knapke has 58 tackles, 6 for loss and a sack. Patrick Klosterman has 55 tackles, 10 for loss and 5 sacks.
