Coldwater Grounds the Rockets 34-0

The Coldwater Cavaliers improved their record to 9-1 (6-1 MAC) with a convincing 34-0 shutout of the Anna Rockets 5-4 (3-4) at Booster Field in Anna.

The win ensures that Coldwater will remain tied with Marion Local at the top of the MAC standings and a victory in the final week of the regular season will result in a shared MAC title for both of these highly successful programs.

For Coldwater is was an unusual victory in that they gained nearly 200 yard on the ground and just over 100 yards passing. But the offensive line had their way with Anna and if it works, you go with the flow.

With just over seven minutes gone on the first quarter clock, the Cavs completed a 53 yard drive as Brad Giere scored from 9 yards out to give Coldwater an early 7-0 lead.

It stayed that way until early in the second when Dylan Thobe found Zach Klosterman for a 30 yard touchdown pass and the lead moved to 14-0.

Late in the second guarter an Anna drive stalled at the Coldwater 36 with under a minute remaining. Coach Otten then pulled out a play he had not called in over two years. Thobe handed the ball off to Neal Muhlenkamp on an apparent counter play, but Muhlenkamp lateraled to Nate Rinder running the opposite way across the backfield. Rinder made it look like a double reverse until he pulled up and found Klosterman down the visitors sideline. hit him in stride with a nice spiral and after he avoided a shoe string tackle, Klosterman pranced into the end zone to give Coldwater a commanding 21-0 lead at half time.

The second half saw the Cavs go almost exclusively to the running game. Rinder got a nine yard rushing touchdown late in the third quarter to push the lead to 27-0 after a failed PAT.

With 4:48 left to play, backup running back Jacob Hartings capped off a 14 play 64 yard drive with a 2 yard run. The drive took nearly eight minutes off the clock and the Coldwater defense secured the 34-0 shutout.

On the night Coldwater ran just 46 plays totaling 307 yards, 196 on the ground and 111 through the air. The defense had one of their better performances of the season allowing just 184 yards rushing and 134 passing for a total of 318 yards on 67 defensive plays.

Thobe was just 3 of 8 passing for 47 yards. Rinder completed his only pass for 64 yards.

On the ground the Cavs were led by Geire with 63 yards, Muhlenkamp had 41, Thobe had 22 and Seth Obringer added 20 more. A total of nine Cavaliers carried the ball in the game.

Klosterman caught 2 passes for 94 yards, Muhlenkamp had 1 for 9 and Rinder 1 for 8.


Next up for Coldwater is a visit from Delphos St. John. The Blue Jays come into the game at 5-4 (4-3 MAC). Like the Anna Rockets, the Jays bring a healthy running game. They are led by Senior Aaron Reindel who has scored 19 touchdowns to lead the MAC. He also has rushed for over 900 yards averaging about 6 yards per carry.

Quarterback Jacob Youngpeter has over 1000 yard passing with 8 TDs and 8 interceptions to go with nearly 400 rushing yards.

Friday nights game will be a milestone for Coach Chip Otten as it will be his 100th at the helm of the Cavaliers.

With just one game left in the regular season attention is beginning to turn to the playoffs. Coldwater holds a solid grip on second place in Region 20 behind CHCA. There is statistically no way that Coldwater will not remain in second so a home game to begin the playoffs is certain.

Prognosticator's favor Cincinnati Aiken (6-3) and Greenview (7-2) to visit Cavalier Stadium in Week 11.
